Autism's moral judgment gap explored

People with high-functioning autism spectrum disorder, such as Asperger's syndrome, often manage to develop strategies that help them deduce other people's states of mind and thus function in society. But a <u>new study</u>, published in the Proceedings of the National Academy of Sciences, finds that these people still have trouble using theory of mind to make complex moral judgments.

UPMC has received \$460,000 in funding from Autism Speaks to continue its participation as an Autism Treatment Network (ATN) site. The three-year foundation grant supports comprehensive diagnosis and medical evaluation for children and adolescents with autism spectrum disorders (ASD). The local site is a collaboration among the Center for Autism and Developmental Disorders at UPMC, Children's Hospital of Pittsburgh of UPMC and the University of Pittsburgh Center for Excellence in Autism Research.

ODR has been contacted by the University of Northern Colorado and Dr. Tracy Mueller regarding research she is conducting on IEP Facilitation. IEP Facilitation is a fairly new dispute resolution method, and Pennsylvania is one of the few states utilizing this process. For that reason, Dr. Mueller is interested in speaking with Pennsylvania parents and educators who have participated in IEP Facilitation within the last two years to learn about best practices in this area of dispute resolution. Voluntary participation by parents and educators will provide valuable information to Dr. Mueller, and, by association, ODR, regarding the successes and challenges of IEP Facilitation and will help guide future refinement of the IEP Facilitation service currently offered by ODR. Therefore, we are seeking your assistance in spreading the word about this project.
