Learning Objectives

- Demonstrate understanding of the special nature of the autistic brain, its unique structure and functioning

Audience

Recommended audience include drug and alcohol treatment professionals, teens and young adults with ASD, parents and extended families, regular and special education teachers, guidance counselors, social workers, clinicians, advocates, psychologists and all those desiring knowledge about ASD.

Continuing Education Credits

<u>Counselors:</u> Western Psychiatric Institute and Clinic is an NBCC-Approved Continuing Education Provider ($ACEP^{TM}$) and may offer NBCC-approved clock hours for events that meet NBCC requirements. Social Workers: This program is offered for 3.0 hours of social work continuing education through co-sponsorship of the University of Pittsburgh's School of Social Work, a council on Social Work Education-accredited school and, therefore, a PA pre-approved provider of social continuing education.
